 - We are doing a lot of things in this moment, under fear and stress
 - Lot of pressure to produce: “I will feel so bad if I waste this time”
 - Lot of pressure to downplay the significance of what is happening
 - “Radical self-acceptance” – accepting everything about yourself, your current situation, and your life without question, blame, or pushback
 - There is no precedent for this, and we are all truly doing the best we can in an impossible situation

Scripture: Matthew 21:1-11

Sermon Notes – Palm Sunday

- Not how we expected to celebrate. Okay to grieve that this isn't the same.
- Psalm 118:25-28 reads: *“LORD, save us! LORD, grant us success! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the LORD. From the house of the LORD we bless you. The LORD is God, and he has made his light shine on us. With boughs in hand, join in the festal procession up to the horns of the altar.”*
- As Jesus entered Jerusalem, those who lived there were confused to see this processional and asked, “Who is this?” Since Jesus had usually avoided the city, its inhabitants did not know Him.
- The crowds on Palm Sunday refused to see Jesus as he truly was, placing their personal desires on him instead.
- Who is Jesus for you?
 - Is he someone to satisfy our wants and goals?
 - Do we do things the way we want and expect Jesus to keep up?
 - Or is he not just Savior who died for our sins but also Lord who rules our lives?
- Pandemic has made a lot of people look at their faith differently...
 - We want assurance that we will be okay – when we say okay, we mean safe and healthy here. That's what the crowds in today's passage wanted – come overthrow this government and establish yourself as an earthly king and set everything right again...make us feel comfortable and safe

- Jesus came to share the gospel with us – that it is by faith in Christ we are saved, that his death on the cross broke the curse brought on by Adam – we do not have to pay for our sins, because he has, and that the Triune God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit – will always be with us
- This week, we will go through the last week of Jesus’ life here on earth. Here is my usual disclaimer: *Going from Palm Sunday “Hosanna!” to Easter Sunday “He Is Risen” without observing Holy Week deprives us of an important part of our faith. We move from celebration to celebration and miss the teaching, the gathering of the disciples, the betrayal, the arrest, the trial, the crucifixion, and the death of Jesus.*
- Let’s continue to keep worship at the forefront of our lives
