INTRODUCTION

- Achan: what are the consequences of our sin? How does our sin affect other people?

BACKGROUND OF PASSAGE

- We must never underestimate the amount of damage one person can do outside the will of God.
- Apples in barrel – one rotten apple eventually spreads that rottenness to the others.
- Doctrine of original sin in Adam and justification of faith through Jesus Christ.

FOR US TODAY

- We now live in smaller family units – easy to feel self-sufficient, we can do things ourselves, we don't need anyone else.
- We are one body in Christ...all of us Christians, everywhere.
- Look at our own sin – what are our “devoted things?”
- How does our sin affect others?
