- Second 40 years...fled to Midian, worked for Jethro
- Third 40 years...led the people of Israel

DEATH OF MOSES

- Moses died at the age of 120.
- His own sin kept him from entering the promised land...

FAITHFULNESS OF MOSES

- Moses was faithful to walk with God
- The secret of his life was his humble walk with the Lord
- Moses was a true shepherd
- Moses identified with the people of God in their suffering

MOSES' GREATEST ACCOMPLISHMENT

- Moses accomplished many things – his resume was impressive
- But he did them at God's command
- He was a servant of God

OUR GREATEST ACCOMPLISHMENT

- What would you list as your accomplishments?

- God gave Moses the gifts and skills necessary to do what he did
