INTRODUCTION

- Last week: looked at the Holy Spirit
- This week: consequences of not seeking God, obeying God, or teaching

THE BOOK OF JUDGES

- They let people live among them who did not honor God.
- They followed other gods.
- God lifted His hands.
- We see this pattern in Judges.

WHO DID NOT KNOW THE LORD

- *¹⁰ ... another generation grew up after them, who did not know the LORD or the work that he had done for Israel.*
- Colossians 3:20-21 – *Children, obey your parents in everything, for this pleases the Lord. Fathers, do not exasperate your children, so they won't become discouraged.*
- How are we teaching the next generation?

- Why do bad things happen?
 - Consequence of the Fall
 - Other people sin against us
 - Our own sin

LOOKING AT OUR SIN

- Broader definition – anything we put our affection on
- Ask God this week:
 - After what created things are we lusting, thinking they will fulfill us?
 - Where are we compromising...trying to do two things at once?
 - What are we listening to?
 - Are we actively seeking the voice of the HS, or are we listening to voices that want to tear us down?
