## Sermon Notes:

### INTRODUCTION

- Last week – how do we respond when bad things happen to us?
- This week – how do we respond to others when they are suffering?

### WHAT JOB'S FRIENDS GOT RIGHT

- They came to him – they stopped what they were doing
- They empathized with him – wept aloud
- They sat with him – seven days and seven nights, not saying a word

### WHAT JOB'S FRIENDS GOT WRONG

- The three men gave a series of speeches
- Eliphaz puts blame on Job. "Think now," he says, "who that was innocent ever perished? Or where were the upright cut off? As I have seen, those who plow iniquity and sow trouble reap the same." (Job 4:7-8)
- Bildad: "See, God will not reject a blameless person nor take the hand of evildoers." (Job 8:20)
- Zophar: "If iniquity is in your hand, put it far away, do not let wickedness reside in your tents. Surely then you will lift up your face without blemish; you will be secure, and will not fear....Your life will be brighter than the noonday." (Job 11:14-15, 17)
- Many inaccuracies, primarily involving why God allows people to suffer

### HOW CAN WE MINISTER IN THE NAME OF JESUS?

- Last week – how do we respond when bad things happen to us? Is it a consequence of our sin? Cause and effect? Is it an attack from the enemy? We are all subject to attack because we are Christians. Is it a consequence of the Fall – things are not perfect?
- This week – how do we respond to others when they are suffering? When we are aware of a friend who is hurting, we can go to the person, mourn with him, and spend time with them.
- And our words can be comforting...if we are careful what we say
- Job 16:1 – Job called his friends "miserable comforters"

### Scriptures on comfort:

- Galatians 6 – *My friends, if anyone is detected in a transgression, you who have received the Spirit should restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness. Take care that you yourselves are not tempted. Bear one another's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ.* Even if we do need to help restore someone, it is with gentleness
- Ephesians 4:1ff – *I therefore, the prisoner in the Lord, beg you to lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.*
- Ephesians 4:31 – *Put away from you all bitterness and wrath and anger and wrangling and slander, together with all malice, and be kind to one another, tenderhearted...*
